  - TE, RTP

# SAFETEA-LU "active transportation" (AT) funding

- \$286B, 1-2% for AT, although:
  - Nearly 10% trips nationally are walk / bike
  - Disproportionate safety
- RTP: \$370M
- CMAQ: \$8.6B (small % to AT)






### Pilot Community: Columbia, Missouri

With a population of less than 100,000 residents, Columbia, Missouri is the smallest of the four pilot communities. The city is home to the University of Missouri-Columbia, a major research


university. Thus, median age in this pilot community is the youngest of all four pilots, hovering around 27 years old. Like the other three pilot communities, more than 85 percent of the city's 45,000-person workforce commutes by vehicle (either alone or in carpools).


